## The 16 to 19 Tuition Fund 2021/2022

City of Bristol College is committed to ensuring the tuition fund is used in accordance with the Government's guidance by:

- producing and publishing this statement setting out how the fund will be used to support the most disadvantaged students
- recording the use of the fund, including references to individual students who receive support, the needs of those students, the number of hours of tuition delivered and retain the evidence of the tuition provided
- deliver the extra tuition and spend the allocated funds in the academic year 2021/22

## Support tuition, both small group & 1 to 1 activity will be prioritised for the following students who are enrolled onto a 16-19 study programme:

- Students who have not achieved a grade 4 or 5 in English and/or Maths.
- Students who have achieved a grade 4 or 5 in English and/or Maths, who are from an economically disadvantaged background who need catch up support.
- Students who have an EHCP
- SEND Students who have experienced additional disruption to learning because of their specific needs & disabilities

## How the fund will be used:

At City of Bristol College, we are using the additional funding to provide students on 16-19 Study Programmes with: Coaching, mentoring and tutoring for individual students and small groups.

- We will use existing & or recruited teaching & support staff.
- Coaching and mentoring will be planned by our named catch-up coordinator and tutor, including motivation and performance coaching -podcasts, drop-ins, mentoring sessions, small group workshops.
- Maths and English mentoring/ catch up sessions/workshops & support.
- GCSE and functional skills revision workshops.
- Study Skills workshops.
- Vocational/ Academic skill builder sessions.
- Targeted sessions to improve engagement for SEND students.
- · Targeted sessions for learners with an EHCP
- Targeted sessions for young people who are from an economically deprived area.
