

What are my options?

Young people

It is now compulsory for all young people to stay in learning until they are 18 years old. **This does not mean you have to stay at school.** There are a number of different pathways available to you after your GCSEs including a full time college course.

Each post-16 pathway is designed to help you develop new skills, prepare for the workplace or progress to higher education. One pathway is an apprenticeship; an opportunity to learn and earn.







Adults

You do not have to be a school leaver to join an apprenticeship. Adults can join an apprenticeship training programme too, whether you are looking for a new opportunity or employed and looking to upskill. Apprenticeships are now available in a number of levels too – depending on the qualifications you have already achieved.

Why choose an apprenticeship?

The West of England is an economic leader with an economy worth over £33 billion a year. A net contributor to the national purse, with a population of over 1 million people and over 43,000 businesses, our region competes on a global scale. City of Bristol College works closely with employers to enrol 1,000 new apprentices each year.



With your employer, you will work alongside experienced professionals who will help you to develop the skills required in your chosen industry. You will also study at college, which means getting the best mix of practical and theoretical training and perhaps better still, you will get paid.

In April 2020, the national minimum wage for apprentices increases from £3.90 per hour to £4.15 per hour. Many employers choose to pay more than the minimum to attract candidates to their posts.

Who can do an apprenticeship?

Anyone over the age of 16 can apply for an apprenticeship as long as they have finished Year 11 and have not already enrolled on another course, full or part-time. In addition, you will be required to have a contract of employment in place with an employer who has agreed your apprenticeship placement. If you would like to complete an apprenticeship with an employer who has not previously taken an apprentice, our Business Partnership and Enterprise Team can work with them to explain everything they need to know.

How long does an apprenticeship last?

An apprenticeship takes between one and five years to complete, depending upon the level or apprenticeship and the industry sector. You will be required to complete the full length of the apprenticeship to achieve the qualification.

What will I achieve on an apprenticeship?

Level 2 Intermediate Apprenticeship

Equivalent to 5 GCSE passes at grades 4 - 9 (A - C)

Intermediate apprenticeships provide you with an introduction to working in your chosen industry. You will learn new skills and professional practices to develop your confidence and abilities in your career. If you have not previously achieved GCSE English, maths and IT at grade 4/C or above you will need to study Functional Skills in these subjects as part of your apprenticeship.

Level 3 Advanced Apprenticeship

Equivalent to 2 A levels

With an advanced apprenticeship, you will begin to take on more responsibilities in the workplace and continue to develop your skills to produce work to a higher standard. If you have not previously achieved GCSE English, maths and IT at grade 4/C or above, you will need to study Functional Skills in these subjects as part of your apprenticeship.

Level 4/5 Higher Apprenticeship


Equivalent to Level 4/5 NVQ, HNC/D or Foundation degree

At higher apprenticeship level, you would already be working at a professional level. You will often be responsible for managing your own work or projects and may also be accountable for overseeing the work of others.

Level 6 Degree Apprenticeship

Degree apprenticeships are similar to higher apprenticeships, but differ in that they provide an opportunity to gain a full Bachelor's Degree (Level 6) or Master's Degree (Level 7). Degree apprenticeships combine working with studying part-time. They can take between three to six years to complete, depending on the course level.

There are, on average, 23,000 apprenticeship opportunities listed on 'find an apprenticeship' every month

89% of apprentices are satisfied with their apprenticeship; 97% of apprentices said their ability to do the job had improved, and 92% of apprentices said their career prospects had improved

On average, achieving a level 2 or level 3 apprenticeship boosts earnings by 11% and 16% respectively. Although there is variation by subject, most subjects deliver a return of around 10%

Nearly 9 out of 10 (89%) apprentices were satisfied with their apprenticeship overall, and 97% of apprentices said their ability to do the job had improved

The majority (92%) of apprentices in work felt that their apprenticeship had had a positive impact on their career.
